


| February 2005 | Launch of "Begonias of Peninsular

- | March 2005 | Singapore Wins Gold Medal at World Orchid Conference in Dijon, France Singapore's display of orchid plants and cut flowers complemented by the use of dance figurines and accessories won a gold medal at the World Orchid Conference. The Conference Show was held in Dijon, France from 11 – 20 March 2005. Singapore also garnered some 20 prizes for orchid hybrids in the Individual Plants Category.
